



Activity Policies

Students: *Your participation in extracurricular activities at STRIDE Academy is dependent on your eligibility. Make sure you remain eligible by reviewing the information in this brochure with your parents/guardians. Student Code of Responsibilities:

A student who is under penalty or exclusion, expulsion or suspension, whose character or conduct violates the Student Code of Responsibilities and is not in good standing, shall be ineligible for a period of time as determined by the principal or coach.

As a student participating in extracurricular activities at STRIDE Academy, I understand and accept the following responsibilities.

Student Code of Responsibilities Penalties:

1. PSP's
 - a. A student receiving a PSP will receive a verbal warning from the coach and/or activities director.
 - b. A student receiving two PSP's in one sport season will not be allowed to participate in the next game.
 - c. A student receiving three PSP's in one sport season will miss one week of games from the date of the incident.
 - d. A student receiving four or more PSP's in season will be dismissed from the team.
2. A student receiving a detention will miss one week of games from the date of the incident.
3. A student receiving in school or out of school suspension will miss two weeks of practice and games from the date of the incident.
4. School Administration and/or coaches can evaluate student fulfillment of the code of responsibilities. Ineligibility can be determined by both school administrators and coaches.

Eligibility Checklist:

_____ 1. Physical exam within the last three years on file with the school.
(See attachment for explanation).

_____ 2. Making academic progress (to remain eligible a student cannot be failing at mid quarter or receive a failing grade on his or her report card).

_____ 3. All fees and forms are turned in to Mr. Lutterman. Forms include:

- a. Eligibility Statement
- b. School Medical Form
- c. Physical Form or Physician Written Clearance
- d. Emergency Information & Contact Form
- e. \$50.00 Fee.

Eligibility Penalties:

1. First Violation: Student shall lose eligibility in that sport for the next two weeks. If there are fewer than two weeks remaining in that activity, the loss of eligibility will continue into the next activity.
2. Second Violation: The student will lose eligibility for the next four weeks.
3. Third Violation: The student will lose eligibility for the rest of that activity or six weeks which ever is greater.



Activity Policies Eligibility Statement

Informed Consent: By its nature, participation in athletics includes risk of injury and the transmission of infectious diseases such as HIV, Herpes and Hepatitis B and others. Although serious injuries are not common and the risk of HIV transmission is almost nonexistent in athletic programs, it is impossible to eliminate all risk. Participants must obey all rules, report all physical and hygiene problems to their coaches, follow proper conditioning program and inspect their own equipment. Do not sign this form if you are not comfortable with its terms.

I consent to the coach treating injuries and authorize them to discuss those injuries with and release any applicable medical information or records relating to those injuries to coaches, school staff and other qualified health care providers as deemed necessary within their scope of practice.

I further understand that in the case of injury or illness requiring transportation to a health care facility, that a reasonable attempt will be made to contact the parent/guardian, but that, if necessary, the student-athlete will be transported via ambulance or quickest transport to the nearest hospital.

I understand and release any liability from injury during the transport in emergency situations and also to and from activity competitions.
